

May we desire to be holy, and look to our example, Jesus, and always strive more and more to live the way He did, knowing that it was Him who ran the perfect race, making it possible for us to run unhindered.

I began reading through the Psalms over the past couple weeks. What a melting pot of gladness and sorrow, joy and despair, uncertainty and hope. In chapter 16 a few verses reawakened a memory.

During my 2nd year on staff at Nipawin I gave an assignment to one of my student leaders to take something from the Psalms and put it to music. As a side, I thought, 'I might as well do this myself.' God led me to Psalm 16:7,8 which say "I will praise the Lord, who counsels me. Even at night, my heart instructs me. I have set the Lord always before me. Because He is at my right hand, I will not be shaken." With a bit of crafting, a couple verses and a chorus came together. A couple days later I was reading through Psalm 62 and verse 5 jumped out: "Find rest, oh my soul in God alone. My hope comes from Him." A bridge just flowed out in a matter of seconds and the personal song, "I Will Not Be Shaken" was complete. I still play and sing the song on my living room piano somewhat regularly.

"I will not be shaken" is something to remember, as more and more I discover life as an ongoing process of many struggles. Do I set the Lord before me? And if so, like David, can I then see God with me, at my right hand, so that I may not be shaken? It seems that each week, or chapter of life, presents itself with something else to challenge the smoothness of life I desire. This shouldn't be a surprise. All throughout the Bible we read the story of people and, with the advantage of hindsight, see the struggles that accompany their journeys, where they succeed, and where they fail. And failure seems to come each time we don't set the Lord before us-when we forget He is at our right hand, and choose to see only the struggle or how weak we feel in the moment.

In Romans 8:18-30 we are told God's entire creation has been subjected to struggle, and that we will groan inwardly as we await the final and complete redemption of our bodies. But we can find rest in our souls because we have a hope in Him. We have a hope knowing we will attain a full and final salvation where there are no more struggles. As we learn to wait patiently (v.25), be reminded to recognize the grace of God at work through our struggles, bringing about good in our lives through them as we love Him. This refining makes us more like Christ, more capable to impact others, and to show them the hope we are able to live by with the accompanying peace and rest our souls can find in that truth.

So what struggles and challenges do you face as you begin Fall 2018? At NBC, our students have the tremendous opportunity to spend hours being taught God's Word, what it says, all the while living life for the next 8 months (5,840 hours! But who's counting!) with a family of believers where we get to learn how to apply the truths of His Word to our every day lives. That will include a lot of struggles.

Will you commit to pray for our students and staff? As we see in the Psalms we are sure to journey through a melting pot of experiences this 2018/19 year, but may we remember to tightly hold onto the hope we have in God through Jesus Christ. There is rest for the soul to be found even through the greatest struggles of life.



Tell us about the partnership with Action Ventures.

NBC partnered with Action Ventures, whose focus is to train and facilitate short-term outreach opportunities using their gifts, including the arts, personal testimony, prayer ministry and practical work projects. We had a training day in March at NBC, and then a full week of preparation at the beginning of July at the River of Life Church in Calgary. We had the privilege to stay with several Filipino families and learn from them. Mark Sorell led the team, and Kimmie Roszmann and Helmuth Graewe also led different aspects in the training and debrief.

Tell us about the people you met.

Filipinos love to have fun. We would laugh so much together and there was continual joking around between us. They taught me the value of hospitality and how I need to slow down and take time to connect and have fun with those around me. Life doesn't have to be lived in such a rush. The people I met were a huge blessing to me through their love, generosity, and open hearts.

What surprised you about the culture?

We were there during rainy season and it rained almost all of our 17 days there. I was surprised by the fact that they don't go out in the rain – you always have an umbrella with you. I would have a jacket on so I would stay dry but no matter how much I assured them I would be fine, they were adamant that I needed to use an umbrella.
