# LIVING WATER June 2018





"But blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in Him. They will be like a tree planted by the water that sent out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit" (Jeremiah 17:7-8).

It is from this passage that the student leadership team chose the theme for the year: "ROOTED." I had the privilege of being on that team, serving as the head RA in Baxter Hall (the men's dorm). As we worked on choosing the theme for this year, we knew we wanted the theme to accomplish three things. The first was that it had to be something that all students could work on throughout the year. The second goal was that it would be encouraging to us as Christians. The third thing was that we wanted it to be something that would continue to challenge us after the school year was over.

The first part of the passage accomplished our first goal nicely. It gave us the challenge of trusting in the Lord, of becoming like a tree planted by the stream, whose roots grow nice and strong. Something we realized quickly, though, is that this is a process that never really ends. We have to continually work on trusting in the Lord. But it was something we could work on while we were here as students. The entire passage encourages us by reminding us that if we trust in the Lord, we will remain steadfast. Despite what comes, because our roots of faith are deep, we will be blessed by the Lord. The second part of the passage provided the challenge we wanted for after the school year was over—to keep our leaves green, and continually produce fruit. This is something that can only happen when you're rooted in the Lord.

With these things in mind, we decided that "ROOTED" would be just right, along with Jeremiah 17:7-8. We wanted this school year to be a time when we as students could work on becoming solid in our faith in the Lord, so that we could produce the fruit that He would make evident in our lives.

It is with strong roots that a tree is able to withstand drought or heat whenever they may come. And they will come. Our prayer was that through this year of school, all of us as students would develop strong roots, so that when trouble comes our way we could stand strong in our faith and continually trust in the Lord for strength.

This year was good for developing strong roots. Throughout the year we all had many opportunities to put our trust in the Lord. Whether we were writing big papers for the first time, pressed for time to do assignments, encountering new challenges in our ministries, or developing new friendships, we all had chances to trust God for our strength.

We decided that our "fruit" has to be seen by others. There is no fruit if there are no roots, and if the roots aren't healthy and strong, the fruit will demonstrate that. We also decided that our fruit is not for ourselves. Fruit never serves the tree itself—it is used either as food for other creatures, or for spreading seeds and reproducing. Therefore, the fruit that we produce is shown in our service to the Lord and other people.

I pray that this year's fruit will show itself in the lives of all of the students who were at NBC this year. I pray that this year was one that strengthened our faith so that when trials come, we can say that we trust the Lord. I pray that we became ROOTED.


