FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is with excitement that I write for the first time in the Rivers. I am excited, that in Jesus, I get to partner with you; our supporters, our alumni, our staff and with our students, to increase and strengthen the ambassadorship of Christ, in our world. Today, standing in and for Jesus, within the world can look overwhelming, perhaps daunting. However as Paul says in Phil. 2, "we are to become a children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation in which we shine like stars in the universe." With that in mind I had the privilege to share the following from Ecclesiastes 11, on opening weekend.

Vs.1 says, "cast your bread upon the waters". Cast is the word shalach, which means send, bade, farewell... Bread is the word lechem, which means bread or grain for the making of food. That is why some translations say ship your grain across the seas. This passage has the sense of investing what God has entrusted to us and in us. We are called to invest in the kingdom of God.

Further the passage calls us to invest without fear of the unknown. Vs. 4-5 say, "Whoever watches the wind will not plant; whoever looks at the clouds will not reap. As you do not know the path of the wind or how the body is formed in a mother's womb so you cannot understand the work of God the maker of all things". God's word states that there are unknowns in this world, but we are not to stop investing in and for Him, we are not to let the fear of the unknown stop us.

Additionally, vs. 6 says, "sow your seed in the morning & do not be idle in the evening, for you do not know whether morning or evening will succeed or whether both will do equally well." God's word clarifies that we are not to be immobilized by a fear of failure but rather we are to continue investing in the kingdom, in and thru Jesus.

We can confidently invest in the kingdom of God because when Jesus called us in Mt. 28, "to go and make disciples of all nations", He said, "and surely I will be with you always...". Therefore it is as William Frey shared, of the blind man. "One day I asked him, how did you lose your sight? A chemical explosion at the age of thirteen, he replied. How did that make you feel? Life was over, I felt helpless, I hated God. For the first six months I did nothing to improve my life. I would eat my meals alone in my room. One day my father said, winter's coming and the storm windows need to be up—that's your job. I want those hung by the time I get back this evening or else! Then he turned, walked out and slammed the door. I thought, "who does he think I am? I'm blind!" I was so angry, I decided to do it. I felt my way to the garage, found the windows, tools, and ladder, all the while muttering, 'I'll show them. I'll fall, then they'll have a blind and paralyzed son.' I got the windows up. I found out later that never at any moment was my father more than four or five feet away from my side."

Like that story, in spite of the challenges in our generation and our world, it remains exciting in 2017 that a new group of NBC students, staff, alumni, and supporters, are confidently investing in the Kingdom of God, knowing God is with us.

STUDENT HANDBOOK REVISION

Kissing on campus? Now, before you get too worried, I want to share with you my thoughts on this change. To be clear, the kissing we are talking about is limited to a quick hello or goodbye kiss that is discrete and appropriate.

Our aim is to give students an appropriate understanding of physical touch and interaction within a dating relationship. As student's approach milestones in their relationships like, dating, holding hands, engagement and kissing, dialog with their discipleship leaders (deans, 7-24Group leaders) takes place. We discuss the appropriate feelings and intentions that accompany or should accompany these relational milestones.

In the past our policy of no physical contact, "No PC on campus" has protected the reputation of NBC but I believe has left the students themselves vulnerable. In fact, I bet many of you alumni who attended NBC and dated during your time here, even during the "no PC" years, did engage in acts of holding hands, hugging and even kissing.

I want to allow the couples that are mature to properly show physical contact and be examples of Christ-centered dating. When we push the physical aspect of dating into the shadows, the shadows often cover more then we intend. The danger is that we encourage students to hide their physical relationships, unintentionally encouraging them to be physical where no one can see them. The darkness and the place of secret is a very dangerous place—often the enemy's playground.

This will no doubt be harder for us as deans, so do be praying for us. It could look negative for a Christian college, but it will help guard many of our students. One of our cultural values at NBC is "refuse to fake reality". We realize that even in our Christian culture there is much we have trained ourselves to hide in shadows. Our heart is to see our students honor Christ in all area of their relationships.






CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE
