Yesterday there was a downpour of rain mixed with hail at our farm outside Nipawin. Normally I love storms. This year, however, I felt what many of you have felt—my hay crop is being ruined! Swaths of winter feed for our small herd of dairy cattle had not been baled yet. It was not the first rain on my first crop of hay.

Two things caught my attention in the middle of the rain: the beautiful double rainbow in the eastern sky and my wife praising the Lord for the rain. One is a recurring evidence of God's faithfulness (never has God sent another flood over the whole earth—He keeps His promises!). The other is an appropriate response to whatever God sends our way. Ephesians 5:20 says, "Always give thanks to God for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." The Word (Philippians 4:6) also tells me not to be anxious for anything, but "in everything with prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, let your requests be known unto God."

I began to pray and have thanked God for the rain. Our garden (in very sandy soil) loves the regular rains. The 40-foot evergreens in front of our house did not become giants without consistent



Tell us a bit about your family.

I graduated from Nipawin Bible Institute in 1974, married Carole in 1977 and began full-time crosscultural ministry in Sept. 1979. Part of that journey included moving to East Africa in 1982 where we



are continuing to serve with Africa Inland Mission. Our son Nathan, his wife Karen and little Joey are working in the San Francisco Bay area. Our daughter Alicia and her husband Matt, have recently been accepted to serve with Wycliffe Bible Translators (their assignment is still pending). We are currently building a house in Eldoret, Kenya, which is now our home.

What are some highlights of your time in ministry?

We have been blessed by having a variety of ministry opportunities including: missionary aviation, training western and African missionaries, researching and reaching unreached people groups, and more recently, coming alongside African emerging leaders who are birthing African discipling movements. We are blessed by an amazing support team and young African leaders who have invited us to walk life with them as [the] Father raises them up for kingdom purposes.

What have been some challenges?

During these past few months, we have been travelling across the USA and Canada during our home assignment. We are challenged and concerned about the degradation of long term mission engagement and vision coming out of the NA context. We are also challenged by the lack of senior leaders (both within African church communities and our own western mission agencies) who have a vision and are equipped to mentor and coach young African leaders who are longing for older brothers and sisters who are willing to walk life with them.

What has God been teaching you personally lately?

The crucial part of my abiding intimate journey with Jesus - without which I have no influence/impact on those within my spheres of influence. Without Him, I can do nothing!

How did your time at NBI prepare/impact you?

During my time at NBI, [the] Father got a hold of my life and I made a covenant with God...Anything, Anytime and Anywhere. I learned many other lessons but I think this was the main one. In addition, I built lifelong friendships at Nipawin which have been a blessing down through the years.

How can we pray for you?

Pray with us as we seek to come alongside young African leaders through mentoring, coaching, teaching, and training. Pray that we will have wisdom to know how to step back or initiate at the appropriate times. Pray for the many young African leaders whom [the] Father has brought across our paths...we are blessed!

Staff and Alumni Serving in Ministry & Missions

Tell us a bit about yourself.

I am from near MacGregor, Manitoba, which is where I grew up with my parents and seven siblings. I like reading, cooking, going on walks, and enjoying the outdoors.



What led you to NBC?

When I finished high school I didn't have any intentions of going to Bible college, but my cousin was planning to go to NBC and my mom encouraged me to consider it as well. I knew it would be a good investment, but I was nervous about the academics. I applied, thinking that since it was the end of July there was no chance of getting accepted for the fall, but I was accepted.

How did NBC make an impact on your life?

During my three years at NBC, God taught me a lot, not only about understanding the Bible, but also about living as a follower of Christ and how necessary it is to continually be growing and deepening my relationship with Him. Through being part of the community at NBC I also learned how much we as Christians need each other. I saw the encouragement and the support we can be to each other both through good times and hard times.

Where will you be going and what will you be doing?

From September 2019 to September 2020 I will be in Kotido, Uganda, serving with Africa Inland Mission. While I am there, I will get to homeschool the children of a missionary family and be involved in the community and local church. Much of the area I will be living in is still completely unreached with the Gospel.

How can we pray for you?

You can pray that I would have humility in serving, wisdom as I adjust to the culture, and that God would give me a love for the people I will be living and working with.



Tell us a bit about yourself.

I grew up in a Christian family with my parents and 4 sisters in Southern Ontario. Three years ago, my family and I moved to Saskatchewan when my dad got a job at the Youth Farm Bible Camp and we now live on-site at the camp. A few of the things that I enjoy are animals, being outside and reading.



What led you to NBC?

I was led to attend NBC after high school because my faith in God didn't have an impact on my life like I wanted it to and I didn't know how to change that. I also didn't know what I wanted to do after high school, so Bible school seemed like a good way to spend a year.

What led you to do a 3rd year missions minor?

There are so many things that have led me to pursuing the 3rd year missions minor. Already when I was young, I had a heart for those in need and wanted to go to Africa someday. In high school, I went on multiple week-long overseas missions trips, which all deepened my desire for missions and to serve in a third-world country. In the past 2 years that I have attended NBC, God has used many different events and moments to keep nudging me towards missions. At the beginning of my 2nd year, I began thinking about the 3rd year missions minor and as much as I tried, I could not forget about it. It was also during this time that missions was brought up in many sermons, conversations, and classes. With all of that, I finally agreed to where God was leading me and decided to do a 3rd year missions minor.

Where will you be going and what will you be doing?

I have been accepted by an organization, Across Borders for World Evangelism (ABWE Canada), in order to go to Togo, West Africa for a portion of this school year. Throughout my time in Togo, I will be helping the teacher of the missionary kids there and also helping out with a variety of ministries with the local children living in Togo. In the center of the missionary compound where I will be living, there is a hospital, so I will also have the privilege of participating in ministries with those who are at the hospital.

How can we pray for you?

You can pray that God will bring in all of the funds that I need to raise and that I will be able to fight the fears and doubts that come. You can also pray that God will use this trip to show me if full-time overseas missions is something that I need to continue to pursue and that I will come back from Togo closer to God than I was before I went there.
