Dear Friends of NBC.

Praise the Lord! Students are on campus. Classes are running. We have a great staff. Discipleship is happening everywhere you look. Lots of reasons to rejoice! We do have to do things a bit differently this year, but the restrictions do not prevent us from delivering a full program. There are fewer activities and guests on campus, but the Bible is being taught and learned. In fact, these are exciting times and we are training young people to be passionate followers of Jesus Christ with a heart to serve. Forty students are taking classes this fall. While our resident students are engaged in classes here on campus, two courses are also being live-streamed and taught on-line, one of which is an evening course. In January, a modular course will be offered which can be audited at no charge—see the details elsewhere in this newsletter or on our website, nipawin.org.

We have noticed a need to hire a part-time "Campus Pastor." Students come from a wide spectrum of Biblical knowledge: some have only been Christians for a short period of time while others have grown up in the church. The Campus Pastor would support Student Life staff and instructors to help students bridge the gap of what they are learning in class to how they can practically live that out, offering advice and counsel that comes from a significant pastoral experience. This is a half or ¼ time position for a semi-retired man with a pastoral (shepherding) background, a willingness to relocate to Nipawin, the qualifications of an elder, and a passion to serve the Lord at NBC. There is a job description posted on the college's website. Please pass it along to someone you know who may be the man we are looking for.

Now for the really big news! We have four housing units (the three-plex and one house) which are requiring more and more expensive repairs each year. They have been a blessing for many years but need replacement. The board of directors has approved a building project to replace these four units with a four-plex. I am guite excited to look to the Lord to work through His servants to make this venture a reality. The goal is to raise funds and make specific building plans for the project over the winter and break ground in the spring—with completion in time for the school year next fall. See page 3 for a list of the types of things we will be looking for—if you are able to help us with these items (either the items themselves or the money to purchase them), please let us know. God has already supplied a skid-steer for the project (one was donated to NBC last year). The overall estimated cost of preparing the building to move into is \$650,000. Would you pray for wisdom and finances as we pursue this muchneeded structure?

Last but not least, an encouragement from Luke 4:32:"They were astonished at His teaching because His message had authority" (HCSB). This is what NBC teaches—the whole 66 books of the Bible in our 4-year degree. We believe wholeheartedly in the veracity of the Holy Scriptures. What Jesus taught and lived as recorded in the Bible is what we are working to instill in a generation of

students. Thank you for standing with us in this ministry. Blessings.
