NOT THEN—AND NOT NOW!

A Message from John Loge, President

The Apostle Paul was in prison (for the last of his innumerable incarcerations). He was

lonely; he was cold; he was jailed for preaching the gospel. During this final confinement, he wrote his last letter, which we know as 2 Timothy. Notice the content of the epistle: He was nearing execution but he knew of the promise of life (1:1). He was treated poorly—but continued to give thanks (1:3). He did not display self-pity in his circumstances rather, he constantly prayed for others (also 1:3). He was powerless (humanly speaking) to escape Caesar's hate-filled clutches—but he spoke of a spirit of power, love and a sound mind (1:7). And this is just the first 7 verses of the letter! The apostle to the Gentiles was so focused on his eternal reward and helping others to enjoy the same—that he was compelled to keep preaching, writing, and sharing the gospel until the day he died, regardless of his circumstances.

We have lived with the chains of restrictions in Canada for over a year now. We know nothing of the intense hardships Paul was living through—but do we have the same concentration on things above? Do we look for opportunities to share the gospel with those around us?

I was in a recent church service when a lady asked prayer for easier circumstances. The prayer offered in response to this request was more in line with Paul's instructions (inspired by the Holy Spirit): "Join me in suffering for the gospel" (1:8). Paul reminded Timothy that we have been given this astounding gift called salvation by grace AND that we are called to a holy life (1:9-10). You have to look pretty hard in Paul's 13 letters to find a place where he asked to be relieved of hardship. The one place where he

asked to be rid of his thorn (1 Corinthians 12:7ff), God said, "No." Paul's response? "For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong" (v. 10). Is that the way we respond to difficulties? Who knows—maybe these restrictions and the difficulties that we face as a result are here to make us strong!

Here at NBC, we have had two College years heavily impacted first by a shutdown, then by significant restrictions. We are learning to be steadfast, immovable, abounding in the work of the Lord. We look for what we CAN do. We do everything we ARE allowed to do. The gospel is being learned, spoken, taught, and lived here at Nipawin Bible College. God did not give us a spirit of timidity—but of power, love, and a sound mind. That is what we seek to build into our students: lives lived in the power of the Holy Spirit, with love in the forefront of a sound mind.

Back to 2 Timothy...I wonder if we are spending too much time speaking about the difficulties, restrictions, and what we cannot do. Instead, what was Paul's discussion regarding his circumstances? It was guite short: I am suffering (2:9). I am chained like a criminal (2:9). But then he makes a declaration that should ring in our ears today: "But God's word is not chained." What a perspective! Physical chains can be placed on our wrists. God's word cannot be chained. Men can be made to suffer. God's word says suffering is there to make us strong. Men can even kill our physical bodies. God's word says that followers of Jesus, who is the resurrection and the life, will rise again. Is that the way we live? Or do we live as if the gospel is restricted? Remember: God's word is not chained—not then and not now!

HOPE VION


