COURSE DESCRIPTION

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course students will be able to...

- 1. Nurture their connection with other Christians by being able to identify key figures, events, and theological positions in the history of Christianity from early Christianity to 1492 CE.
- 2. Be equipped to learn from their fellow members of the Body of Christ by being able to analyze and interact with primary sources with assistance.
- 3. Apply the wisdom gained from the historical community of the church to evaluate contemporary issues in the student's life and the life of the church.
- 4. Develop and communicate a biblically informed theology of history.

COURSE ASSIGNMENTS

Quiz - 40%

• The student will participate in a weekly quiz. This quiz will consist of two questions, The first question will remain the same, "I have listened/followed along with the assigned video lecture in full." The second question will relate to that week's assigned audio lecture.

Exams - 2 exams, each worth 20% (40% total)

• Mid-Term Exam (20%)

The exam will include the following elements:

- A sit-down 10 minute conversation with your professor covering what you have learned so far in the course. Your Prof will ask you questions related to your time in class and assess a mark based on this learning.
- Questions will come from the lectures.

• Final Exam (20%)

The exam will be a scheduled personal exam time booked with the instructor. Plan for a 15-minute exam. This will be an oral exam and will consist of the following elements:

- Several questions relating to Church History 33 A.D. 1500 A.D. generated from the second half course lectures.
- Responding orally to a question supplied to the student a week prior to the final exam.
- Please book a time with your Prof prior to the final exam. Time slots will be given through a first come-first-serve basis.

Survey - 20%

- The student will find 3 random people (at work, in town, at sport events) and ask and record the following questions:
 - How do you think our culture today has been shaped by Christian history?

- Can you tell me one thing that happened in Christian history and its impact on our world?
- What is one thing that bothers you about Christian history and why? Or What would you change about Christian history if you could and why?
- Please submit your survey-interview-recording to your professor on or before class on the due date listed below.
