COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is an introductory study of the theology, as well as the major themes, in Old Testament Wisdom Literature. As human beings, we have all faced and wrestled with the complexities of living in our world. We all know, or will eventually know, what it means to grapple with the problems of suffering, morality and the meaning of life and love. Biblical Wisdom Literature invites us to consider all areas of life through the lens of "fear of the LORD."

LEARNING OUTCOMES

With successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- 1. Articulate the contemporary relevance of Old Testament Wisdom Literature.
- 2. Grasp the historical context behind wisdom thought and writings.
- 3. Understand major theological themes in biblical Wisdom Literature.
- 4. Appreciate the beauty and wonder of God's Word as it comes to us in this engaging genre while enjoying a deeper understanding of who God is and how He relates to us.

COURSE ASSIGNMENTS

Participation in Class – 5%

• The student will be engaged in class discussion and classroom practical activities throughout the course.

Textbook Reading and Quizzes – 25%

 Each student will be required to read the chapters on Job, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs from the assigned textbook by Estes. The student will be prepared for quizzes on the assigned reading.

Creative Exegetical Project and Presentation - 20%

- The student will choose a biblical passage from the list provided below (or another passage that receives approval from the instructor) and:
 - Research the passage in at least three commentaries until they are confident in the meaning of the passage.
 - Produce an original artistic presentation (eg. painting, ink/pencil sketch, song, monologue, poetry, skit, film, or sculpture). The meaning of the chosen text must be clearly evident!
 - Present/perform the art piece to the class on the assigned date (5-7 minutes)
 being sure to explain the meaning of the text and how the art represents that meaning. The student will also briefly describe the process of creating the piece.

 - o Job 1: 6-12
 - Job 3: 1-26
 - o Job 19: 23-27
 - Job 38: 1-41
 - Proverbs 3: 13-26
 - Proverbs 4: 1-27
 - Proverbs 31: 1-31
 - Proverbs: A collection of proverbs around a certain theme.
 - Ecclesiastes 3: 1-11
 - Ecclesiastes 7: 1-14
 - Ecclesiastes 12: 1-14
 - Song of Songs 2: 1-7
 - Song of Songs 3: 6-11
- The object of this assignment is to *creatively* apply what the student is learning in the classroom to their life and potentially, ministry. With each submission, the student will submit a title page and a bibliography listing the sources they used to research the meaning of the text.
- This assignment will be graded on the basis of:
 - Understanding of the meaning of the text.
 - Creativity.
 - Quality.
 - Effectiveness in communicating the meaning of the text through the artistic medium.

DUE: March 20th

Bible Memory – 20%

• The student will memorize the following verses throughout the semester. The student will write out the verse verbatim with a classmate to witness that it is from memory. The student will indicate their translation and the name of the student who witnessed them writing the verse. The student will then write out the verse as it appears in that translation by the beginning of the class period. The verses to be memorized are:

 Job 1:20-21
 Job 42:4-6
 Ecclesiastes 12:13-14
 Song of Songs 8:6-7

Bible Reading - 10%

• The student will read the entirety of Job, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs. On the due date they will indicate how many chapters they read *this semester* out of the 93 chapters.

Final Exam - 20%

• The student will take a final exam covering the content of the course.
