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a message from the president

Jason Elford

This summer I begin a new journey - as President of Nipawin Bible College. I did not set out for this role when I arrived in 2011, but in God's sovereignty and for His reasons, He has brought me to it.

I'd been reading through *"Lead Like IT Matters"* (by Craig Groeschel) this past February, and came to a chapter touching on three key shortcomings leaders typically fall into. One that was a definite "go-to" for me was personal insecurity, usually connected to what I can do and what others think of me. Growing up, I always wanted to be good at a lot of things, and ultimately tied it to self-worth and confidence. And even though I've grown in many different skills and abilities, sadly, I've often put my confidence in either those things, or the affirmation I received or desperately wanted to.

I think I speak for many in saying that as God pushes us in new directions it's easy to look at our resumes and wonder if He's making a mistake. The chapter on shortcomings went on to remind me that confidence in God is substantial and enduring. When we think our resume isn't "enough" or when we struggle with insecurity it's because we've put our confidence in the wrong things. It's necessary for us to continually

ask God to help us grow in a confidence that is founded in Him.

I'd also been reading through Isaiah in the winter months, and only minutes after being challenged by Craig Groeschel, I read through Isaiah 42:16 which leapt right off the page. *"And I will lead the blind in a way that they do not know, in paths that they have not known I will guide them. I will turn the darkness before them into light, the rough places into level ground. These are the things I do, and I do not forsake them"* (ESV).

When we trust in God (and not idols, as 42:17 goes on to say), we can be assured of His leading, in His way, in His time, leading us down the paths He has prepared us for. What an incredible journey of trust to be on. Earlier this year Isaiah 9:6 reminded me, *"the government shall be upon HIS shoulder."* NBC exists to be part of God's Kingdom and Jesus is the Governor, not me or any other person(s) "in charge." Jesus' shoulders are big enough to carry any weight of difficulties, just as clearly as mine are not. What an exercise in shifting

Jordan served in the area of Admissions Counsellor this past year. He also coached the basketball team. His desire to see students know God and

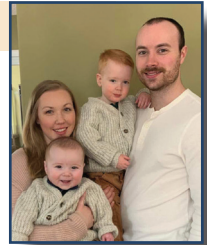
live with integrity has been greatly appreciated. We send him with our blessings and are grateful for his ministry to the students and staff of NBC.



Equipping the Workers Strategic Partnership for Maturity in Christ

Is 25 the new 18? Studies have been coming out over the last several years that would indicate it is, at least in the West. We can see evidence of this in the cultural stereotype of the twenty-something who moves back in with their parents after college, the increased average age of marriage and parenthood, and the difficulty that employers have finding adolescent employees with a solid work ethic. This seems to be a trend that has been happening throughout all history, though certainly accelerated in recent history (as the likely 13-14 year old Mary, mother of Jesus, and her contemporaries would affirm).

Along with the decrease of maturity in general, there is a decrease in spiritual maturity, maturity in Christ (Col. 1:28-29). Biblical literacy continues to decrease. We can no longer assume knowledge that we used to as we teach our students. John

Stott, in a sermon titled *A Call to Christian Maturity*, said,

“Jerome, one of the great church fathers of the 4th Century A.D., wrote in one of his commentaries, ‘Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.’ And we could state the opposite, that knowledge of Scripture is knowledge of Christ... If only we could see Jesus as He is in his full authenticity, in the fullness of His divine human person, and of His saving work. Why then surely we would see how worthy He is of our faith and love and obedience and worship, and we would grow into maturity in Christ.”

His point is that the way to grow in spiritual maturity is to know Christ, and the way to know Christ is to know God’s Word. If he is right, it is no wonder we see a decrease in spiritual maturity as biblical literacy drops!

Now, I do not claim to know all the specific causes of these downward trends in maturity, though there is a strong correlation between affluence and prolonged adolescence/spiritual immaturity (Matt. 6:24; 19:24 – certainly a problem for us in the West), nor am I ranting against this fact and longing for decades gone by. I want to explore how we are to deal with the current situation in which we find ourselves this day.

Taking our cue from Ephesians 4:11-12, as a teaching institution, we are to teach so that the saints are equipped for the work of ministry, to build up the Body of Christ. If, on average, students are coming out of high school less equipped and the work of ministry has not become easier, then we are dealing with an ever-increasing amount of equipping that needs to happen for ministry preparation. We could attempt to cram that extra equipping into our already limited time that we have with students and risk burnout, or we can strategically partner with other Bible-based organizations who can continue the equipping process, who can help bridge the gap.

I am not proposing that there is a measurable level of spiritual maturity a person must reach before they can do “the work of ministry,” or that a person must “arrive” before they can serve, I am merely proposing that “growing up” takes more time and intentionality these days (though there will be exceptions). Looking back in history to the founding of this school in 1934 (then called Two Rivers Bible Institute), I am confronted with my own lack of maturity compared to people like George M. Little who, when he was a few years younger than I, was given a ditch on top of a hill at the beginning of the summer and tasked with having classes there that fall. By the grace of God, he rose to the challenge along with many other faithful men and women. It would have taken a miracle comparable to the Exodus for me to find myself in that position and take that on.

Let me give you an example of how strategic partnership can contribute towards maturity in Christ: One of our past fourth year graduates, Sharmyn Abrahamson, went on to receive specialized training with Ethnos for one and a half years, then spent a year working and raising support before being sent to minister in the Philippines. Here are some of her reflections on how God used that type of partnership to prepare her for ministry:

“God is so faithful, and He used each step of my journey to prepare me for what He had in store. Growing in my walk with the Lord at NBC, training how to specifically plant thriving churches among the least-reached people of the world, building relationships, and sharing about future ministry with those who are partnering with me—every aspect is one step at a time, walking with the Lord and being obedient to what He asks. Our experiences and training are opportunities to grow in faith, build godly character and therefore

faithfully minister wherever the Lord places us.”

We strive, in the power of Christ, to be an effective link in the chain as we prepare more students for a life of ministry, equipping students to faithfully minister, whether that be as contributing members and leaders in their churches or vocational missionaries.

We must ask ourselves, “What is more important than equipping and being equipped for the work of ministry?” Join me in praying the “second Lord’s Prayer”: *“The harvest is abundant, but the workers are few. Therefore, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest”* (Luke 10:2 CSB). There is work to do in the harvest, and any farmer can tell you that kind of work is urgent.

Even though we have some experience at this, the same sense of unpreparedness and the unknown seems to have us on our toes. This, at least in my mind, seems to reinforce the notion that this baby will be a completely new experience. We know only enough to know that nothing is certain, and that God alone sees what lies ahead. That, while sometimes stressful, is exactly how it ought to be. There is peace in knowing that God is all-knowing.

This past year the NBC Board has been meeting via video for weekly prayer meetings and I have had the privilege, and I really do mean privilege, of meeting together with these men to discuss and pray for the college and many other things. With lower freshman numbers, hiring of a president, development of the college, or other things that can seem like problems in any given moment, stress and fear can begin to creep in against our faith. We may wish we had more control, or think others ought to be doing more, or try to change a course of events by our own effort, or just wish we knew the future. But then we forget the One who already knows and who has the only real power. I have been encouraged to see the Board, on a weekly

basis, bring these things before God and commit them into His infinitely capable hands.

In Matthew 6 Jesus assures his disciples that God knows about their future needs, and that they should first seek God's kingdom. In 2 Corinthians 12:9-10 we learn that a full realization of our weakness, as we lean on Christ, is when Christ's power is made manifest in us. So whether it's having a baby, or thinking about NBC, we must commit all things into the hands of Christ realizing that God already knows, and that our weakness will allow God's power to be known.
